MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN

SES's Arunamai College of Pharmacy, Mamurabad, Jalgaon

AND

Khandesh Ayurvedic Pharmacy, Jalgaon

This memorandum is made and entered into on this 22nd day of January 2018 between **Arunamai College of Pharmacy, Mamurabad, Jalgaon**

(hereinafter called college) situated at Mamurabad, Taluka and District Jalgaon an Institute of Pharmaceutical college established by a special act of Parliament of Republic of India Khandesh Ayurvedic Pharmacy, located at B-1, MIDC, Jalgaon, 425003 (hereinafter called "COMPANY" which expression shall include its successors and permitted assignees)

1. OBJECTIVES OF THE MOU

The objective of this Memorandum of Understanding is:

- a. To promote interaction between COLLEGE and COMPANY in mutually beneficial areas.
- b. To provide a formal basis for initiating interaction between COLLEGE and COMPANY.
- c. To grant the research & projects works in COMPANY for graduate, post graduate & research students (those who are perceiving there Ph.D.) & The guidance will be given by the Guide from the COLLEGE which is approved from NMU (North Maharashtra University)

2. PROPOSED MODES OF COLLABORATION

COLLEGE and COMPANY propose to collaborate through

- a. Sponsoring student who are doing their projects / fellowships / industrial training in four years B. Pharm., two year M. Pharm. & perceiving there Ph.D. (research Student) for their projects in COMPANY'S laboratory.
- b. Sponsoring eligible employees of COLLEGE for doing B. Pharm, M. Pharm /Ph. D. degrees in COMPANY. The eligibility criteria for selection will be as per norms of COMPANY.
- c. Sponsoring R&D projects which may be carried out wholly at COMPANY or at premises of COMPANY or partly at COLLEGE and partly at COMPANY.
- Any other appropriate mode of interaction agreed upon between COLLEGE and COMPANY.

Each of the above modes of interaction will be initiated by entering into a separate agreement between the two parties.

3. FORMS OF RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

The form of any of the said Research and Development Program (hereinafter referred to as "Research Program") will not be subject to a separate Research Agreement entered into by the Parties but may also include the following:

- a. In their own existing facilities The performance of research individually by each Party or concurrently by both Parties in mixed groups at their own facilities with regular exchanges of results.
- b. In a separate research and development facility The performance of research by the technical personnel of both Parties working together in the facilities of one Party or in mixed groups at the facilities supported/ sponsored by either Party
- c. Third parties The performance of research by the Parties together with one or more third parties.

4. TECHNICAL AREAS OF COLLABORATION

The principal technical areas of collaboration between COLLEGE and COMPANY will be as set out as follows

- 1. All the project given to students are decided by COMPANY
- 2. COMPANY will try to give all necessary technical support to students
- 3. COMPANY will try to give all necessary raw materials & chemicals to the students ,If in case its unavailable it will be provided by COLLEGE or students have to arrange it from there end (in this case neither college nor company will renumbers to the students)
- 4. The name of project will be kept hidden from COLLEGE & students by the COMPANY

5. AGREEMENTS FOR RESEARCH COLLABORATION

Each research collaboration undertaken by the parties hereunder shall be initiated by the signing of a separate research agreement between the parties, which will describe in detail:

- a. The nature, scope and schedule of the research collaboration.
- b. The form of the research collaboration.
- c. The estimated cost of the research collaboration together with the amount of funding, if any, to be received from third parties.
- d. The treatment of intellectual property and data rights, including patents, industrial design registration, copyrights and all other proprietary information (including innovations not patented, designs not registered etc.) which result from the research collaboration or which belong to a party and are used in research collaboration.
- e. other provisions as may be mutually agreed upon, including provisions covering the consequences of default or termination by a participant, term, arbitration of disputes and applicable law.

6. CONFIDENTIALITY

- a. During and for a period of three years from the date of disclosure, each party agrees to consider as confidential all information disclosed by the other party in written or tangible form or, if orally disclosed confirmed in writing within thirty days of disclosure and identified as confidential by the disclosing party.
- b. The obligations above shall not extend to any confidential information for which the receiving party can prove that this information:
 - is in the public domain at the time of disclosure or comes within the public domain without fault of the receiving party.
 - is already known or become known to the receiving party
 - is received from a third party having no obligations of confidentiality to the disclosing party,
 - is independently developed by the receiving party; or
 - is required to be disclosed by law or court order.

7. NON-EXCLUSIVITY

The relationship of the parties under this MOU shall be nonexclusive and both parties, including their affiliates, subsidiaries and divisions, are free to pursue other agreements or collaborations of any kind. However, when entering into a particular research agreement, the participants may agree to limit each party's right to collaborate with others on that subject.

8. TERMS AND TERMINATION

This MOU, unless extended by mutual written agreement of the parties, shall expire 5 years after the effective date specified in the opening partial This MOU may be amended or terminated earlier by mutual written agreement of the parties time. Either party shall have the right to

unilaterally terminate this MOU upon 60 days prior written notice to the other party. However, no such early termination of this MOU, whether mutual or unilateral, shall affect the obligations of the participants under any Research Agreement, Confidentiality clause as referenced in clause 6 above, or any other agreement entered into pursuant to this MOU, which obligations shall survive any such termination.

9. RELATIONSHIP

Nothing in this MOU shall be construed to make either party a partner, an agent or legal representative of the other for any purpose.

10. ASSIGNMENT

It is understood by the Parties herein this MOU is based on the professional competence and expertise of each party and hence neither Party shall transfer or assign this Agreement, or rights or obligations arising hereunder, either wholly or in part, to any third party.

11. COSTS OF THE MOU

Each Party shall bear the respective costs of carrying out the obligations under this MOU.

12. SIGNED IN DUPLICATE

This MOU is executed in duplicate with each copy being an official version of the Agreement and having equal legal validity.

BY SIGNING BELOW, the parties, acting by their duly authorized officers, have caused this Memorandum of Understanding to be executed, effective as of the day and year first above written.
